Communications Update

Mrs. Compagno reported that despite best efforts to publicize the September 30 PreK to 8 Facilities Presentation, there were not a lot of community members present. Review of Policy 1330 Use of School Facilities, Buildings and Grounds

Mr. Neviaser reviewed recommended changes to this policy which required updating with the opening of the new turf field and the need to establish cost and usage of this field.

Mr. Neviaser reviewed the recommended changes to the policy. The committee wordsmithed the policy and made several additional changes to the policy and the facilities usage form.

The committee discussed what to charge non-profit and for-profit groups for the use of the turf field. Mr. Neviaser reviewed what Old Saybrook, Waterford and East Lyme Public Schools charge for the use of their turf fields. There was consensus to charge non-profit groups \$250 per hour and for-profit groups \$500 per hour. There was also a suggestion to create a form that the renter must sign indicating that they know the rules of using the turf field and are responsible for any damages incurred to the field.

This policy will go before the Board of Education at their November 3 meeting.

There being no further discussion, the meeting adjourned at 5:40 p.m.
